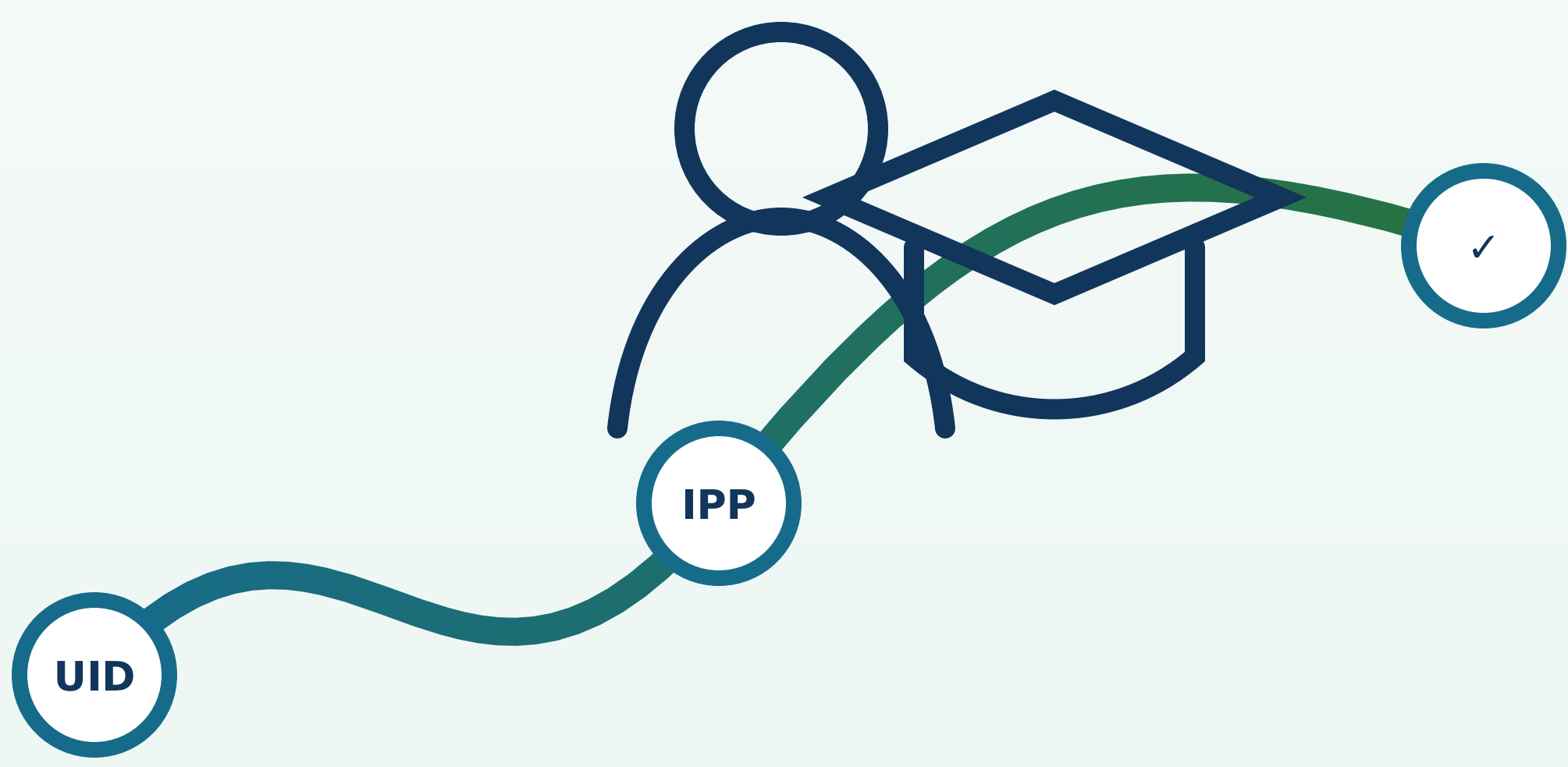

UID, university connection, IPP and task participation

For students using www.sdgspass.com

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This controlled document is published in advance for the first invited EDU SDGS PASS cohort on 28 September 2026 and the full EDU SDGS PASS launch on 10 November 2026. Where a live controlled task displays a newer effective rule version, the live controlled value governs that task.

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Start here

From the first invited EDU phase on 28 September 2026, go to www.sdgspass.com, select Personal, register with your university email address and receive one UID. To bind the UID to a School EGC ID, provide the UID to your school and complete the verification information the school requires. You may claim the school's exclusive tasks only after the school verifies your information and approves the binding. The same student process continues after the full EDU launch on 10 November 2026. Registration is free. After UID issuance, the first required task is the SDGS online assessment pathway. The UID holder must complete all 17 assessments, SDG 1 through SDG 17, before a one-time award of 170 IPP Points and 170 IPP Score is posted. Completing fewer than 17 assessments creates no partial award. Claiming a task with requirement T deducts T IPP Points. After verification and approval, 2T Points are awarded and T Score is added. IPP Points may increase or decrease according to UID-linked task outcomes. IPP Score is a one-way cumulative record of verified execution outcomes and is not spent when a task is claimed.

UID	Your lifelong individual identity
University binding	Shows an active verified affiliation to a university EGC ID
IPP Points	A spendable balance used to claim tasks
IPP Score	A one-way cumulative record of verified execution outcomes

1 Create and protect your UID

1. Go to www.sdgspass.com, select Personal and register with your university-issued email address.
2. Verify your email address.
3. Receive your single lifelong UID.
4. Keep your login and verification methods secure.

Do not create a second UID when you change university or employer. One UID may connect to multiple verified EGC IDs.

2 Connect to a university

The Global WHED ID is the external institutional reference for the university layer only. It does not verify you as a student. Your student affiliation is established through the university EGC ID, your student affiliation information and the required EMJ.NEXUS and university process. Reference to a Global WHED ID does not imply endorsement, certification, partnership or governance by IAU or WHED.

1. Provide your personal UID to the relevant school.
2. Complete the student verification information required by the school.
3. The school verifies your UID and submitted information, then approves or rejects the binding.
4. After approval, confirm that the active binding shows the correct School EGC ID before claiming a school-exclusive task.

A university email address and UID registration do not automatically create a school relationship. The binding becomes active only after you provide the UID, complete the school's required verification information and receive school approval. You cannot claim a school-exclusive task until the binding is active.

3 Complete SDG learning

After UID issuance, the first required task is the SDGS online assessment pathway. The UID holder must complete all 17 assessments, SDG 1 through SDG 17, before a one-time award of 170 IPP Points and 170 IPP Score is posted. Completing fewer than 17 assessments creates no partial award. Claiming a task with requirement T deducts T IPP Points. After verification and approval, 2T Points are awarded and T Score is added. IPP Points may increase or decrease according to UID-linked task outcomes. IPP Score is a one-way cumulative record of verified execution outcomes and is not spent when a task is claimed.

4 Use IPP Points and IPP Score

Measure	Changes when	Purpose
IPP Points	Earned, spent, returned or rewarded	Claiming eligible tasks
IPP Score	Learning or approved task participation is recorded	Cumulative Score with traceable ledger events

Example: after earning 170 Points and 170 Score, you claim a 20-Point task. Your balance becomes 150 Points and 170 Score. After approval, 40 Points are returned and 20 Score is added, producing 190 Points and 190 Score.

5 Claim and complete tasks

1. Open an eligible university task issued from the 24-task education whitelist.
2. Read the task period, required Points, evidence and approval conditions.
3. Claim the task. T Points are deducted immediately when the task requires T Points.
4. Complete the task within the published period.
5. Submit the required evidence.
6. Wait for the issuing organisation or university to decide.

Task claiming has no cooldown. A task issuer may be subject to an issuance cooldown under the selected controlled task.

6 Understand outcomes

Outcome	Points	Score
Approved	2T Points returned	T Score added
Force-majeure cancellation	Deducted Points returned	No Score
Expired after claim	No refund	No Score
Rejected	No refund	No Score

The task issuer decides whether the published conditions and evidence requirements were met. Support can explain a status but cannot approve a task for the issuer.

7 Participation records and DOI

Your UID-linked records preserve learning, claims, evidence outcomes, Points and Score events. After at least 365 days of eligible participation data, you may apply for DOI Personal Participation Evidence. Application terms and charges will be published on 24 October 2026.

- Accumulated participation data evidence for the selected period
- IPP Score Ledger in JSON, CSV package, XLSX and Markdown
- DOI link
- DOI Landing Page

A DOI record is participation evidence. It is not a degree, professional qualification, certification, performance rating or third-party endorsement. Review the identity and public fields before publication.

8 Help and privacy

- Contact the issuing university about task approval or rejection.
- Contact platform support about UID, login, binding or ledger errors.
- Use only your own student affiliation information and contact information.
- Review the current EMJ.NEXUS Privacy Notice before submitting personal information or requesting a public DOI record.

One-page checklist

- ☐ Email verified
- ☐ UID received
- ☐ Personal UID and required verification information provided to the school
- ☐ UID-to-School-EGC-ID binding approved by the school
- ☐ All 17 SDG assessments completed and the one-time 170/170 award posted
- ☐ Task conditions read before claim
- ☐ Evidence submitted before expiry

Points and Score continuity

At each annual platform cycle, the IPP Points balance resets to the higher of 170 IPP Points or 10% of the balance immediately before reset. The 10% alternative is capped at 500 IPP Points. IPP Score does not reset and continues to accumulate as the individual's actual participation record. Historical tests, task outcomes, Points and Score events remain traceable.
